

RESOLUTION NO. 24-013

A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE PUEBLO AREA COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS FY 2023-2027 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM (TIP) AND ASSIGNING MULTIMODAL TRANSPORTATION AND MITIGATION OPTION (MMO), AND CARBON REDUCTION PROGRAM (CRP) FUNDS IN THE AMOUNT OF \$969,205.00 FOR PROJECTS THAT PROMOTE "COMPLETE AND INTEGRATED MULTIMODAL SYSTEM"

Whereas Colorado Senate Bil 2021-260 generated \$236,512 from Fiscal Year 2022, \$145,252 from Fiscal Year 2024, \$262,441 from Fiscal Year 2025 for a total of \$644,205.00 dedicated funds for MMO Projects, in the Pueblo Area Council of Governments (PACOG) planning area; and

Whereas \$255,801 from Fiscal Year 2024 and \$69,199 from Fiscal Year 2025 for a total of \$325,000.00 have been dedicated from Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) to the Pueblo Area Council of Governments planning area; and

Whereas said MMO funds of \$130,399.00 will be used to receive funds for Pueblo Transit Stop Solar Light Project. This project will install solar lighting at 33 bus stop locations throughout the City of Pueblo and unincorporated Salt Creek; and

Whereas said MMO funds of \$513,806.00 will be used to receive funds for the construction of a paved trail that will connect the S. Joe Martinez trail to Civic Center Park in Pueblo West; and

Whereas said CRP funds of \$325,000.00 will be used to receive funds for the installation of 3-Phase Power Transformer, one DERO BiKeep 5-bike charging rack, 6 ABB AC Wall box electric vehicle charging connectors and 2 ABB Terra 54 DCFC EV charging connectors; and

Whereas all projects that appear in the FY 2023-2027 PACOG Transportation Improvement Program shall also be included in the Colorado State Transportation Improvement Program, if required; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PUEBLO AREA COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS that:

SECTION 1:

The Pueblo Area Council of Governments expresses its desire to use its SB2021-260 Multimodal Transportation and Mitigation Option and Carbon Reduction Program of \$969,205.00 for the installation of solar lighting at transit stops, construction of trails at Civic Center Park in Pueblo West, and installation of electric vehicle supply equipment.

SECTION 2:

The PACOG certifies that the transportation planning process is being carried out in conformance with all applicable federal requirements; and hereby directs the Urban Transportation Planning Division to implement the necessary revisions to the Fiscal Year 2023–2027 Pueblo MPO TIP to include this amendment.

SECTION 3:

This Resolution shall become effective upon passage and approval.
