A RESOLUTION ASSIGNING MULTIMODAL TRANSPORTATION AND MITIGATION OPTION FUNDS (MMOF), IN THE AMOUNT OF \$85,200 FOR PROJECTS THAT PROMOTE "COMPLETE AND INTEGRATED MULTIMODAL SYSTEM"

WHEREAS, Colorado Senate Bill SB 2021-260 generated \$85,200 dedicated funds for MMO Projects, in the Pueblo Area Council of Governments (PACOG) planning area; and

WHEREAS, said MMO funds of \$85,200.00 will be used to receive funds for the Safe Streets and Roads For All Grant, for partial match requirement. The City of Pueblo received \$681,600 from the Federal Highway Administration for the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A), Safety Action Planning Grant. This project will create an action plan that will investigate Pueblo's most dangerous roadways and intersections and determine mitigation strategies. The City of Pueblo will fund the remaining ten percent match needed for the required twenty percent match.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PUEBLO AREA COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS that:

The Pueblo Area Council of Governments expresses its desire to use its SB2021-260 Multimodal Transportation and Mitigation Option, of \$85,200.00 for the Safety Action Plan project.

A RESOLUTION ASSIGNING MULTIMODAL TRANSPORTATION AND MITIGATION OPTION (MMO), IN THE AMOUNT OF \$161,500 FOR THIS PROJECT THAT PROMOTES "COMPLETE AND INTEGRATED MULTIMODAL SYSTEM"

WHEREAS, Colorado Senate Bill (SB) 2021-260 generated \$161,500.00 dedicated funds for MMO Projects, in the Pueblo Area Council of Governments (PACOG) planning area; and

WHEREAS, said MMO funds of \$161,500 will be used to receive funds for the Industrial Boulevard and Purcell Boulevard intersection Design. The project includes the study and design of Industrial Blvd and Purcell Blvd intersection. Full turn signalization will be analyzed, plans and specifications will be developed to include trail, utilities, lighting, traffic lights, sidewalk, stormwater, pavement, and electrical power. Survey work will also be completed to align with the Elk Valley Project. Relocate existing traffic signal control box and full design will account for ADA accessibility as well as the mobility and safety of all users.
