Active Communities Tool (ACT)* - Darena Herschler CDPHE

Darena Herschler is from the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, she is the Built Environment Coordinator. She went over State Physical Activity and Nutrition (SPAN) program and how it works. The Active Communities Tool (ACT) is an action planning guide and assessment modules (6 modules) to improve community-built environments to promote physical activity. It starts with a board question and in each module and then gets detailed in plans and policies. After the modules, there will be a report on what can be done soon or if it will take some time.

CDOT is going to building a (7 foot?) barrier to the east of the intersection to prevent people from crossing over, should help eliminate fatalities and serious injuries. Richard Arko said that since they closed the hotel there, the pedestrian count has decreased significantly.

Colorado Department of Transportation Region 2 (CDOT R2) and Headquarter Updates - Geoff Guthrie and Kathleen Collins

Action Requested: Informational

Geoff Guthrie said that they are working closely with Eva and her team, and Lindsey is working on the projected planning total spreadsheet. This will break down the first 10 years and the next 10 years in increments of 5 years. This includes averages per year over the next 25 years from specific funding sources (MMOF, TAP, etc...).

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Kathleen Collins said that the Statewide Transportation Plan has been adopted by the Transportation Commission (TC). She requests the rural transportation adopts theirs through resolution. TC will take a road trip this month and conduct a hybrid meeting including a report, consent agenda, action item, and budget amendment action item. Next STAC meeting will be in person at CDOT HQ in Denver.

9. Senate Bill 25-30 – Dylan Goodman

Dylan Goodman discussed this bill, this requires local agencies to provide the MPO a prioritized project list to identify gaps in transit, bicycle, and pedestrian infrastructure and access. MPO must receive the list by December 31, 2025.

10. Regional Priority Program (RPP) Update*- Geoff Guthrie

Geoff Guthrie discussed the RPP formula, this means that PACOG MPO will get 15.8% of Region 2 funding. We will get a bit more funding (18.98%) in 2026, this means that future years will decrease then level out in 2032. You can find the listed projects and what funding is available in the packet.

- a. Aviation Pueblo Airport Greg Pedroza did a short thanks to everyone who has helped. He said there were lessons learned for the next event. Around 7,000 in attendance. Denver Air Connection has been doing great so far. He also mentioned improvements for the people walking along Keeler Parkway.

The MyRide App is in the final agreements, launch in November (tentatively). All Solar Lights have been installed. Pueblo Community College (PCC) students ride free. There is a new bus stop at the City Park swimming pool and at the entrance near Ditmer.
